**ORDER RE SUPPLEMENTAL  
CLASS NOTICE ERROR**

---

Plaintiffs and Wells Fargo jointly notified the Court that JND, the settlement administrator, inadvertently sent supplemental class members incorrect class notices. The Court has reviewed JND's declaration explaining how the error occurred. The error needs to be correct so that class members receive correct information about the prior remediation amount they received, and the settlement amount they will receive.

Therefore, the Court orders as follows.

The new Notice Date shall be **September 10, 2021**. On or before September 10, JND shall mail corrected notices.

Class members shall have until **October 25, 2021** to request exclusion, submit claims for emotional distress, or file notices of objections.

The corrected notice shall specifically call out October 25, 2021, as the deadline for requesting exclusion, submitting a claim for emotional distress, or filing objections.

The corrected notice shall also **specifically state**: “This notice supersedes the prior notice dated August 13, 2021.”

To the extent consistent with the foregoing, the Court adopts the settlement administration timeline proposed at Dkt. 312-5 at 7.

The final approval hearing currently set for December 2, 2021 is **VACATED**.


A final approval hearing shall be held on **January 6, 2022 at 11:00 AM**. The hearing shall be telephonic.

With respect to attorney’s fees (Dkt. No. 320), we will wait until the very end when the Court can be certain there has been no prejudice from the terrible error. The Court counts on counsel to avoid such errors and counsel should not lay off their own responsibilities on the claim administrator.
